ICONIC F1 CARS IN RED BULL LEGENDS PARADE TO WOW FANS AT AUSTRIAN GP

The 2026 Austrian Grand Prix will feature an extra item on the programme: GP ICONS brings racing cars that made Formula 1 history during the period 1975 - 2010 back to the track, immersing Spielberg in an atmosphere of motorsport nostalgia. The cars in the Red Bull Legends Parade will be driven by some of the biggest names to have competed in the highest echelon of the sport. Emotion-laden moments will be provided by Rubens Barrichello in the legendary Ferrari F2002 and by Mathias Lauda, who will be driving his father Niki's world championship-winning car. Rubens Barrichello in Michael Schumacher's Ferrari: The Austrian Formula 1 Grand Prix has produced a wealth of famous anecdotes. One of the best known concerns the team orders controversy involving Scuderia Ferrari in 2001 and in 2002 when Rubens Barrichello was told over the team radio to cede victory to eventual world champion Michael Schumacher. Now, in a conciliatory gesture to the past, the Brazilian will take the wheel of the championship-winning Ferrari F2002. Fans of the premier class get goose bumps just thinking about moments such as these.

When the son takes to the track in his father's car... it can be no less spine-tingling. In this case, much to the delight of the fans, Mathias Lauda will be driving the Ferrari 312T in which Niki Lauda celebrated his first world championship title in 1975 and won the eternal gratitude of everyone at Maranello by securing the Constructors' championship.

Maximum downforce for maiden title: The RB6 designed and built by Red Bull Racing is another car that delivered an incredible run of success. Sebastian Vettel secured his first championship title driving it in 2010 and, together with Mark Webber, the outfit's first Constructors' title. David Coulthard has the honour of firing up the Austrian team's sixth racing car once again. Designer Adrian Newey still raves about the RB6 today as one of the cars that generated more downforce than almost any other in F1 history.

Legendary eye-catchers at Spielberg: Also sure to turn heads are the six-wheeled Tyrrell P34 and P34B from 1976 and 1977, which presented not only drivers but also tyre manufacturers of the time with a major challenge. The notorious 'Brabham Vacuum Cleaner' became a cult classic, in which Niki Lauda secured a commanding victory in just a single race in 1978. The car, with its controversial rear fan, was eventually withdrawn by the then team boss Bernie Ecclestone following protests. These and numerous other memorable events surrounding ten cars and icons of that era are what make the Red Bull Legends Parade the emotional highlight of the Austrian Grand Prix.
